Locard's Exchange Principle

principle stating every contact with another person, place or thing, results in an exchange of physical materials

Anthropology science of skeletal analysis

Criminalistics science of evidence collection and analysis

Odontology science of dental analysis

Toxicology science of poisons

Criminology academic study of crime and criminals

Criminologist individual who studies crime and criminals

Self-Incrimination

act of implicating oneself in a crime

Coroner

officer who investigates deaths

Treatise

formal written work which provides a comprehensive discussion of a subject

Culpability

amount of blame to be placed on a person for a fault or wrong

Ubiquitous

extremely common and present everywhere

Criminalist

forensic scientists responsible for collecting and examining physical evidence

Autopsy

examination of body to discover cause of death

Grand Jury

group of individuals selected to determine the validity of the charges made against a suspect before trial

Municipality

city or town with a local government
