

Forensic Video Files

Directions:

In groups, you will be creating a series of short video clips (similar to a Snapchat, Instagram story or Vine) to explain important events in the history of forensic science.

1. Your instructor will divide the class into groups of four. Make sure at least one student has a smartphone the group can use to shoot the clips.
2. Research the history of forensic science and select one event from each of the following elements to feature in your clips:
 - Major contributors to forensic science
 - Major scientific breakthroughs for forensic science
 - Important events
 - Major legislation
3. Notify your instructor of the groups choices so no two groups select the same event.
4. Develop four creative short video clips no longer than 60 seconds each, to explain each of the events selected. Use props, costumes and whatever else is needed to help provide the necessary context for your video clips.
5. Perform and record the clips.
6. Create a citation sheet listing all sources used.
7. Turn in your video clips in the manner requested by your instructor and be prepared to share them with the class.
